- The location in Central Europe international crossroad of roads, rail, but also water, and air transport

KEY STRATEGIC PRIORITIES (until 2030)





- Increasing the attractiveness of secondary vocational education























THE ROLE OF REGIONS **IN GREEN AND DIGITAL TRANSITION**





Regional Level (Berlin)

- Sustainable urban production through digital + green + working environment transformation
- "Zukunftsorte" as drivers for change (e.g., living labs for innovation and deregulation, cooperation with science)

EU-Level:

- Metropolitan Regions are magnets for international talents and core for innovations for the whole country / EU \rightarrow focus on support and development
- Similar challenges: land and housing shortage, high cost of living, traffic, ... \rightarrow knowledge exchange and transfer between Cities






Birth of the Economic Transition Portfolio








